It is diesel fuel storage for the new emergency generators that are going to be put in to upgrade the electric service. Diesel fuel is typically not flammable. It needs pressure to be ignited. Masters said the Code requires it for fuel tanks.

O'Hara said the work includes the replacement of the electric service to the Hospital and the replacement of the existing emergency generators. Two (2) vertical aboveground storage tanks are being added to the site to provide 96 hours of fuel capacity. One tank is 10,000 gallons and one is 6,000 gallons. The tanks are double wall fire rated and have service to the 15kV primary switchgear and a pad mounted transformer. leak detection and monitoring. The electric service includes underground
