<u>Wienke, Glenn – West Street</u> – Wienke shared many memories of the farm. He was born on this farm and lived on the land for many, many years.

Wienke has been an active member of the Sanborn Area Historical Society since its creation in 1996. He helped the Society to gather millions of artifacts for the Museum. School classes come to the Farm and Wienke shares his past. The kids love it.

Wienke is here to support the Museum, always is and always will, and prays it will continue. The money from the solar farm is greatly needed to continue with the Farm.

<u>Reed, Bill – President – Sanborn Area Historical Society</u> – Reed thanks this Board and all Boards prior, for their continued support of the Society.

The Society is chartered by New York State Board of Regents, 501C-3 Non-profit. The Museum preserves and displays the rural character of the area. Wienke is correct in the millions of artifacts in the Museum. They have been entrusted to the Society by the people of this area. They are used for educational purposes for current and future generations.

The Museum has over 500 members who volunteer untold hours working to make it what it is today. The income from the proposed solar project is needed to ensure the future of the Museum.

The Sanborn Area Historical Society asks the Board to approve the proposed solar project.

<u>Townsend, Gary – Townline Road</u> – Townsend spoke on behalf of Museum Curator Bonnie Haskell.

Haskell thanks the Town Board for all of the things, now and in the past, done for the Museum. This would not have been possible to continue, since 1996, without you.

When the Society asked the Town to help move a school house, you did without hesitation. Over 700 school students have come to the Museum for learning.

The financial part of the project will help the Museum get back up and going.

<u>Craft, Ron – North 4th Street</u> – Craft joined the Society and is amazed at the work these individuals do at the farm. The Society and farm help gives the Seniors in the area a purpose, something to do and be involved with. Craft suggested the Police might escort the Seniors to the Farm.

The Museum and Farm need the Solar Farm to exist.

Lyle, Steve – Lower River Road – Lyle asked for an update of the Stonehaven Camp purchase.

Broderick said the Town is in the purchase process, with hopes to close in mid-July. The Town is trying to obtain 2 grants to help with the purchase price.

DEPARTMENT HEAD STATEMENTS

Supervisor requested to address Finance Officer Agnello's agenda items now.

Agnello is asking for two budget revisions, but a Resolution needs to be passed first.

Geiben MOVED the following Resolution

WHEREAS, the Town of Lewiston approves the salary of all Town employees each year in its annual budget, and

WHEREAS, the salary of the Town Supervisor has been duly published and approved for the years 2020, 2021 and 2022 within the body of the Town's annual budget; to wit \$43,583 per year in 2020 and 2021, and \$44,455.00 per year in 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Town Supervisor has routinely waived a portion of the approved Supervisor's salary to remain in compliance with the retiree earnings limits as established under Section 212 of the New York State Retirement and Social Security Law, as modified from year to year, and

WHEREAS, it has come to the recent attention of the Town of Lewiston that above referenced retirement earnings limit had been temporarily suspended due to COVID-19 concerns for periods of time during the years 2020, 2021 and 2022 by an Executive Order issued by the Governor Andrew Cuomo's Office and as continued by Governor Kathy Hochul's Office, and

WHEREAS, under said Executive Order, the Town Supervisor would be entitled to collect his full salary for his position without violating the retiree earnings limit, and

WHEREAS, the Town Supervisor's salary had been reduced by \$330.00 per pay check over forty pay periods in 2020 and 2021, representing \$13,204.62 in waived salary over the period of the suspended retiree earning limit, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Lewiston desires to allow the Supervisor to collect that portion of his salary, previously waived, for the period defined within the above referenced Executive Orders,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is hereby entitled to receive his previously waived salary on a retroactive basis in the following manner.

The Supervisor will receive 2 payments in pay period #11 in addition to his regular salary as follows:

2020 - 20 pay periods * 330.12 = 6,602.31

2021 - 20 pay periods * \$330.12 = \$6,602.31

The additional payments for 2022, a total of \$9,455.00, are being paid with his regular salary this year as per the current earnings limit suspension.

Essex Homes – Building Permits

The Town received a letter of request for permission to provide building permits. Theses permits are needed for sublot 7 and sublot 51 of Bridle Path Lane. A meeting was held with Tim Berger, Morreale, Jacoby, Lannon and Masters to discuss this. A punch list was created.

Discussion included no occupancy permits until after the road is built.

Masters said Essex Homes plan is to have all the punch items done by the June 27th meeting. Then move forward with the road dedication. The foundation for the homes will be in, but will be several months away from occupancy.

Broderick has spoken to Masters extensively after the walk-through, and Broderick has no problem with this, must finish the punch-list before any occupancy or any additional building permits are issued.

Lannon said they have put the temporary fence by the house, that was one item. The other is if the Board would consider recording an updated decommission bond at the time of the building permit.

Masters would add removal bond and the Pilot. All motions for other solar farms have been contingent upon Attorney/Engineering approval of the bond and the pilot. The motion must state Site Plan approval, Special Use Permit and the SEQRA completion.

Bax said the motion would be – approve the project as previously approved, subject to Attorney and Engineering approval, the negotiation of a pilot, the installation of a 320-foot temporary chain link fence for the house to the east of the project, updated decommissioning bond at the time of the building permit and removal bond.
